

Nexus, Neighborhood, Needs

Driving down La Prada past the Eastfield College campus, you've probably noticed our sign: Nexus Recovery Center. We're not exactly new neighbors;

we've been in this 12 acre location since 1990. It's past time we introduced ourselves.

The "Recovery" in our name refers to recovery from ad-



diction. Our mission is to empower women to break the cycle of addiction and, in doing so, create purposeful lives, stable families, and a stronger community. We address

all aspects of a woman's life: her recovery, her family, her relationships, her health, and her future. Our clients live on campus as they learn the skills necessary to sustain their recovery.

We became a leader in treatment for women by welcoming children to accompany their mothers into treatment. We opened a program for adolescent girls and expanded the adult women program. We are the only provider in Texas to provide treatment for pregnant or newly parenting teens. The Children's Center provides day care for the children of our clients, our employees, and neighbors like you. We are building a new adolescent dormitory, set to open in the fall.

Whom do we serve? Lowincome women and adolescent girls and their accompanying children. Most clients come from counties around Dallas; but due to our unique program, Nexus accepts clients from throughout the state. Social service agencies, independent school districts, the justice system, Child



Protective Services, hospitals, shelters, local churches, and family members refer clients to us.

What are our programs and services? We focus on the unique needs of female substance abusers. The program's therapeutic model centers on removing clients from unhealthy environments to a safe and supportive one. Programming addresses issues that frequently distinguish female addicts from their male counterparts: eating disorders, trauma, sexual abuse, and parenting. Nexus offers therapeutic and educational activities for the children, too.

We offer detoxification services, residential services, group and individual counseling, family education and therapy, an outpatient program, an aftercare program with alumni support, a transitional housing program, and more. In 2011, we served 1,963 women and adolescent girls and 340 children who accompanied their mothers into treatment.

We could not do our work without community partnerships and collaboration. For that reason, too, we are happy to say, "Hello, Neighbor!"

White Rock Hills Branch Library Fast Becoming a Major Community Asset

I am often asked about the importance of libraries. There are many who believe that with the Internet and electronic books, the library is now irrelevant. I beg to differ. Libraries provide access to information for all and are a necessary

component to any great city or community.

With the economic downturn, free access to information has become more important than ever. This is evident in the fact that on any given day at the White Rock Hills Branch Library all 19 computers are in constant use. Customers are doing job searches, creating documents or checking email. On opening day we issued 82 new library cards and checked out more than 2,000 books!. Many others had their cards reinstated after several years of disuse.

The branch is also providing much-needed free educational programs. Every Wednesday morning at 10:30 a fun and entertaining program is presented using stories, songs and activities. Storytime helps prepare children in pre-reading skills needed to enter kindergarten. Another fun family program series is Library Live! presented by Thriving Minds on the first Saturday of each month. It can be a storyteller, music, or hands-on art activity. English as a Second Language classes began in August. For parents attending the ESL classes, another group of volunteers conducts programs for their children at the same time as the ESL classes.

The White Rock Hills Branch Library is quickly fulfilling its role as a community meeting place. On any given Saturday afternoon neighbors run into each other and visit. We are an entertainment destination for many in the area. One comment made to staff was from a woman who spends most of her days alone in her residence. Now that the library is within walking distance, she said, she comes often to browse the collection and visit with staff.

As you can see, today's modern library is more than just books. White Rock Hills Branch Library is making a positive difference for many in the community—some we may never know how we helped, but we are here ready to serve when needed.

"Knowledge Makes a Difference" FRI Victims Outreach Program

In 2009, Ferguson Road Initiative recognized a need for victim outreach services after a rise of sexual assault/abuse and domestic violence murders within the community. As a result, the Victims Outreach Program was put into place to combat these issues and to help adult women

and children. The Victims Outreach Program developed partnerships with community agencies to ensure adequate services in addressing abuse issues. Some of these agencies included The Family Place, Brighter Tomorrows, Hope Coalition, Parkland Hospital Victim Intervention Program/ Rape Crisis, and Mission East Dallas. Partnerships were also established with many faith-based organizations in Far East Dallas.

Through these partnerships, more than 400 victims have been served since the program's inception. However, this number is minute compared to the actual number of victims who continue to suffer in silence. Oftimes victims feel there is no way out. As a result, their abuse goes on for years until tragic consequences occur. The most impressive aspect about the Victims Outreach Program is that it reaches even the silent victims; creating the awareness, knowledge, and support needed to really help.

The Victims Outreach Program is proud to partner with Dallas Christian Women's Job Corps (DCWJC), a faithbased organization that provides life skills and job readiness training. One day while I was facilitating a workshop I noticed a woman who sat quietly, took notes, avoided eye contact, and displayed extreme difficulty with sitting still. She never took part in any of the discussions; however, halfway through the workshop she abruptly left the room, broke down crying and admitted to being in an abusive relationship. She had recognized all of the signs of abuse reviewed during the session. She was so emotional that she had to be comforted by 2-3 women before even leaving the workshop. According to the woman, she didn't really think her situation was that bad and she thought that every person goes through things like this in a relationship. It became clear that she probably came from a home where abuse and violence were common occurrences; making it acceptable in her personal value system. Jane was able to get the support and encouragement that she needed that day. As a result, she gained the strength needed to leave her abuser.

Abuse and violence have no limits as to whom they will affect. It is imperative to gain insight and pass it on to those who are in need. I will be leaving FRI in the fall and I would like to say it has been a pleasure working for the Far East Dallas community. I'm thrilled to report that the Victims Outreach Program has been re-funded by the State of Texas for another grant year. 

Forest Hills Neighborhood Has Deep Roots

In 1845, Warren Angus Ferris selected a 640-acre tract of land near White Rock Creek to homestead. The Ferris Farm would later become the core of what is now known as Forest Hills.

Ferris, born in 1809 in New York, went west as a young surveyor, where

he explored and surveyed the Rocky Mountains and the Yellowstone National Park area. He was involved in writing the Texas Declaration of Independence in 1836 and was reported to have been a captain in the Texas Army at the Battle of San Jacinto. In 1840, he began surveying what was to become Dal-



las County. His field notes record the arrival of John Neely Bryan, who founded the City of Dallas in 1841.

In 1847, Ferris began his family cemetery on what is currently the NW corner of St. Francis and San Leandro Drive. The last burial there was circa 1906, and about all that remains today is a Texas Historical Marker.

In 1924, Leon L. Fechenback dedicated the plat of the Forest Hills Addition, then six miles from the Dallas city limits. The land was bounded by Garland Road, Lakeland Drive, the Santa Fe railroad, Highland Road and one block of San Rafael Drive. Ads in the 1924 Dallas Morning News proclaimed "Your home in a forest – Your home built among massive oak, elm, and pecan trees – Built within a stone's throw of beautiful White Rock Lake" as reasons for settling there.

Forest Hills was annexed into Dallas in 1945. The quiet, tree-shaded residential area, where walkers, runners, and bicyclists abound, has a small town feel within a big city.




