### Celebrating FRI's Backyard

It's a thrill to share news about all the great things to celebrate in FRI's backyard! The Trinity Forest Spine Trail (TFST), which plans to open this Fall, along with the recent completion of White Rock Hills Park and Highland Road, is ensuring all residents along the lower Ferguson Road corridor have access to recreation and green space. In addition to the new paved trail linking the TFST and Santa Fe trails, 8-miles of new trails

are planned for mountain bikes adjacent to the TFST with an expected completion date in 2024.

The White Rock East area will celebrate the opening of a new grocery store, El Rio Grande Latin Market, thus providing healthy food options in a former food desert near Buckner Boulevard and John West Road. On the horizon, is a possible Senior Activity Center to be established at the Claremont Village Shopping Center at Highland and Ferguson Roads. Our most important advocacy project to date, is ensuring the \$24MM White Rock Hills Recreation Center is placed on the 2024 city Bond Program.

There is much to celebrate and be proud of, but these results are impossible without the support of our community through membership and volunteer efforts. Please help support FRI as we continue to grow and advocate for you.



## Dallas Off-Road Bicycle Trail in FRI's Backyard

The Loop Dallas isn't complete yet, but already exciting new projects are coming to East Dallas. The new Trinity Forest Spine Trail (which runs between White Rock Creek and Ferguson Road) opened fifty acres of adjacent forested land. Recent residential


surveys as part of the current Samuell Grand Master Plan rated "mountain bike trails and parks for all ages and skills levels" high on the list of desired recreational activities.

With support from the City of Dallas, The Loop Dallas in partnership with the Dallas Off Road Bicycle Association (DORBA), plan to build a state-of-the-art mountain biking park and trail. "This new mountain bike skills park and trail will be world-class, right here in East Dallas," said Sean Laughlin, DORBA board member. "We've retained one of the best trail design and construction firms in the U.S. and this new trail will be the envy of large cities everywhere."

Philip Hiatt Haigh, Executive Director of The Loop Dallas said, "It's very rare that a city with the population and density of Dallas has fifty acres of 'new' forested land available for a new park. An opportunity like this deserves a great trail that residents can enjoy".

The plan includes a bike skills park with beginner, intermediate and advanced lanes and various fun and challenging features. In addition, several miles of natural surface, flowing trails will be built through the woods taking advantage of the natural terrain and minimizing disruption of natural resources. The result will be the opportunity for residents to have a nature-filled experience right in Far East Dallas, and less than five miles from downtown Dallas.

"Many Dallas residents who like to ride their bikes on dirt trails are forced to drive to trails outside the city. This new trail, combined with The Loop Dallas, will make it safe and fun for riders to ride right from their house to mountain bike trails," said Laughlin. Mountain biking has been one of the fastest growing outdoor activities in the past several years, especially among families with kids. Once completed, DORBA volunteers will maintain the new trails. DORBA has over 400 volunteers who help maintain, repair, and improve 200+ miles of natural surface trails throughout the Metroplex. The bike park and trail will be funded by a private donor and is expected to be completed by the end of 2024.





The first new project needed to complete The Loop Dallas' 50-mile citywide trail network will be open this summer!

With the Trinity Forest Spine Trail, you can connect from Far East Dallas to the Santa Fe Trail, White Rock Lake, and Deep Ellum – completely by trail.

## Starbucks: Serving More than Great Coffee by Susan Hopper

There's more to a Starbucks
Community Store than a great cup
of coffee. Last summer Starbucks
opened a Community Store in Casa
View Shopping Center. They are
committed to learning about the
needs of the community and how
they can help uplift that community.

Before investing in Casa View,
Starbucks researched the area and
relied on the human development
index to determine where to build.
The Casa View area demonstrated
vulnerability in health, education,
and income with 20% of the
population below the poverty level.
Starbucks chose this area for a
community store because they
found that Casa View is an ethnically
diverse neighborhood and is known
for neighbors taking care of each
other.

To learn more about the Far East Dallas community, a Starbucks spokesperson said, "We contacted Dallas City Councilmember, Paula Blackmon's office, and she referred us to the Ferguson Road Initiative (FRI). Starbucks relied on FRI to help kickstart our outreach efforts and understand the community better." FRI was able to connect Starbucks with Wilkinson Center, Owenwood Farm & Neighbor Space, St. Vincent

De Paul, and other nonprofit organizations. Starbucks has been working with the Wilkinson Center by hosting an in-store toy drive in December, and an on-going food drive. Store employees also volunteer at Wilkinson Center. Laura Ingram, Engagement Manager at Wilkinson Center is thrilled when the Starbucks volunteers arrive to shop with clients, restock pantry shelves, and put hygiene kits together. She says, "The Starbuck volunteers are great because they have a customer service attitude so when they serve our clients, they serve with a smile and treat them with respect."

As a community store, Starbucks hires locally and has created 32 local jobs in the Casa View area. The Starbucks Community Store serves as a meeting space for all community members and programs. With a large community table, book clubs and Coffee with Cops have met at Starbucks, and it is open to other organizations to use.

The Starbucks Foundation supports its community stores by offering foundation grants twice a year. The employees chose Wilkinson Center and Owenwood Farm & Neighbor Space to each receive a \$2,500 grant to help provide food for the community. Starbucks hopes to build 100 community stores throughout the United States.

Far East Dallas is benefiting from the support of a corporation that cares for the community it serves.

# Addressing the Far East Dallas Food Desert

The Ferguson Road Initiative (FRI) is aware of large swaths of our community that qualify as food deserts by the USDA in Far East Dallas. That's why we are thrilled to learn that El Rio Grande Latin Market is locating a full-service grocery store in the White Rock

East community, near the Buckner Boulevard and John West Road intersection. The store is part of a \$1.3MM economic development agreement with the city of Dallas which was facilitated by Councilman Adam Bazaldua.

Located in a former Kroger store, El Rio Grande Latin Market is committed to providing fresh food, produce, meat and baked goods. "Each store is geared toward the diversity of the community. You can expect a full-scale bakery with homemade breads, and Tres Leches cakes; all made from scratch in the store. The kitchen will serve hot meals with fresh salsas and guacamole. Natural juices can be found in the Palapa Bar," says Tangela Ingram, Director of Human Resources for the company.

El Rio has a commitment to recruit, hire, and train local employees. FRI has worked with the store since October, connecting them with our area workforce training nonprofits and agencies and recently introduced them to the FRI community at a semi-annual town hall meeting.

The store is looking forward to opening their doors in this Spring.

# Local Family Opens Lubella's Patisserie in Casa View

Upon entering Lubella's you are instantly overwhelmed by the enticing aroma and tempting cakes, cookies, scones, and croissants. Ishmael Trejo began in the restaurant business in the kitchen, and over the years has



worked as a server, manager and now the owner of Lubella's Patissierie located at 10323 Ferguson Road in the Casa View Shopping Center. He and his wife, Maria Becerra, the pastry chef, chose this location because they live in Casa View and wanted to offer good food and good bread to their community. Maria said, "We named the restaurant after our daughters, Luanna and Isabella – Lubella's."

Maria, a former pastry chef at Bullion French Restaurant, started a business in her home during COVID-19, after the restaurant closed. Ishmael was not working at the time and began making his savory sides, including his delicious pesto chicken salad, while Maria created her pastries and cakes, suppling restaurants, friends and family, building up a customer base.

On September 25, 2022, more than 350 customers attended their grand opening. Business has been growing ever since! "You can now enjoy breakfast sandwiches on the weekends and in the Spring we will have outdoor seating with a brunch menu," said Ishmael.

### Flexible Seniors & Chair Yoga

We are born, then before you know it, life happens and the years seem to fly by.
Getting older is something we all experience. I woke up one day and the world said, "I too was a senior." I began to search for a way to improve my balance and coordination. Yoga seemed a curious thing,

practiced by really limber folks in funny little pants. Yoga has been around for centuries. Chair yoga is a modified version accomplished in or with the aid of a chair.

Benefits come through the use of poses and intentional movement, every part of your body is involved. Muscles are stretched and exercised, and an emphasis is placed on the body's circulation. With an instructor as a guide, participants move at their own pace and ability. Breathing and meditation helps one to focus on the self and relieve stress. Jessi, a local instructor, strives to provide a space where one can cultivate an honest relationship with their body." She says, "It opens the door for many healthy outcomes."

Another benefit of participating in a class is getting out of the house and making new friends of fellow seniors with a common goal. In a typical class you will meet those who have been benefiting from yoga for years or newbies like Lorna, a 72-year-old recent retiree who owned a large pool cleaning business. Used to being active, she was seeking a way to keep moving but not take a toll on her physically. You may meet someone like Georgia, one of my personal heroes. At 85 this great-grandmother with eleven grandkids has been engaged with yoga since the age of 65. Twelve years ago, she switched to chair yoga after a period of illness. "It was a way for me to regain my strength. If I can keep moving & stay strong, I can get up and do whatever I want to, when I want to," she says.

# Community Creates Literacy Connection

The FRI literacy connection shines a light on three programs dedicated to promote literacy and education for young readers: Reading Partners, Book Drive for Kids, and the Lions' Free Little Library.



Reading Partners collaborates with schools to provide one-on-one tutoring sessions to students who are struggling to keep up with their classmates. By matching students with dedicated volunteers, Reading Partners helps students gain the skills and confidence they need to succeed academically. "Through the support of volunteers, over 8,000 students in DFW have been helped on their road to literacy. An hour a week from a dedicated volunteer can have lasting impacts on the life of a child. Join today – a student is waiting for your support," said Reading Partners Community Engagement Director Ashley Huff.

Book Drive for Kids collects and distributes books to children who might not have access to them otherwise. The organization believes that all children should have a rich knowledge base that only comes from access to great stories. During the current school year, Book Drive for Kids, with help from FRI and generous sponsors, has held Reading is FUNdamental Free Book Fairs at local elementary schools, allowing every student to select books based on their interests and reading levels. "Our partnership with FRI has helped connect us to the children who need and desire books to have at home. Plans are underway for every elementary school in the FRI area to participate in a free book fair," said Michelle Cook, Executive Director of Book Drive for Kids.

The Lions' Free Little Library at White Rock Hills Townhome Apartments is a small book exchange that provides access to books for adults and children. The nonprofit strives to be a catalyst for building community and increasing book access through a global network of volunteer-led book exchanges. The library is well-stocked, and It's About the Kids, Inc. organizes regular Story Times where volunteers read to children, and volunteer mentors help with homework. "We believe that youth and adults should have access to appropriate materials and programs to support literacy," said Baldwin Hamilton, co-founder of It's About the Kids, Inc.


