









WRHRC BIG PICTURE: RECREATION GAP MAP





Demographics

- The current 2014 population is 91,256.
- The current number of households is 36,542.
- 45% of homes are owned,
 43% are rentals
- The median age is 32.3.
- The median household income is \$40,160.



Demographics

- Approximately 50% of the population is employed in the service industry.
- Only 18% of the adult population has a college degree.
- The fastest growing population is Youth and Seniors.



Demographics

- There are approximately 23,000 children in the FRI service area.
- 7,000 children under 5, and 16,000 between 5-19.
- 2014 ethnicity is
 30% White, 20% Black,
 46% Latino, 4% Other.
- 1500 at-risk youth live within walking distance of the site.


