MINUTES

- Vikki Martin began the meeting at 6:50 pm by thanking our new Founders Circle member MSL Health Care.
- She announced that our Challenge Grant brought in over \$30,000.
- Yard signs regarding Dallas Police Department recognition are on sale.
- A percentage of purchases from smile.amazon.com will go to FRI. We have a goal for \$1,000 from this program.
- Neighbors were encouraged to meet each other and chat.
- McDonald's was recognized for providing refreshments for the evening.

Action Item: A motion was made by Nicole Milller and seconded by Mary Wuertz to approve tonight's agenda and the September 11, 2017 minutes. Motion passed.

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

Kerry Goodwin said that FRI's Volunteers in Tax Assistance (VITA) program has already served 450 families.

Law enforcement, First Responders, and the community are working together on a "Race for the Community" walk/run at 8:00 am on April 7 at City Hall, 1500 Marilla.

Ken Benson spoke on the Airbag Recall. Less than ½ of suspected defective airbags have been replaced. www.Airbagrecall.com

Delorian Brown, FRI, spoke on the Operation Beautification cleanup event on March 3.

Access Storage, Uplift Education, and Sherman Williams are working together to restore the Pegasus statue in front of Access Storage.

Sgt. Keitric Jones, Dallas Police Department, spoke on 16% overall reduction in violent crime, 777% increase in Volunteers in Patrol (VIP) participation, and a 1100% increase in Crime Watch groups over the past 6 years. He spoke on an upcoming Crime Summit meeting for Crime Watch and HOA chairs. On March 9, there will be a cookout at the DPD NE station to honor a fallen officer.

ELECTIONS

Action Item: Bill Coleman, FRI Board, presented a slate of candidates for the FRI Board. The slate was approved by acclamation. (see end pp 5)

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TEAM AND WHITE ROCK HILLS PARK

Matt Nicolette, spoke on plans for the park, including parking areas, entryways, pavilions, lawn area, and playground. Plans will work for now and for later inclusion of buildings,

garden areas, iconic sculpture, etc. Tree plantings could take place at a community event, possibly in October. The first phase should be completed in 6-8 months after groundbreaking at a cost of \$400,000. The Casa Blanca Apartments will be demolished when all leases have expired, and the site will become part of the park.

HIGHLAND ROAD RECONSTRUCTION

Haythan Hassan and Horacio Pizzarello, City of Dallas Public Works Department, spoke on the project going from Ferguson Road to the entryway into Primrose Senior Living (2000 Highland Road). The roadbed will be widened from 24 ft. to 37 ft. and will include buffered bike lanes, wide sidewalks, on-street parking and landscaping. They should be breaking ground in November, and project should take about 12 months to complete.

The bridge replacements on Lakeland, north of Ferguson, should be completed by October, before the Highland project starts.

OWENWOOD COMMUNITY CENTER

Neil Moseley and Mitchell Boone, White Rock United Methodist Church, spoke on providing free diaper distribution every second Saturday. They met with Vikki Martin regarding the future of Owenwood Church facility regarding consideration for seniors. A resulting task force came up with a focus on 5 areas: Transportation; urban farming; intergenerational activities; health and wellness; and fiscal well-being.

SENIOR VILLAGE PROPOSAL

A Senior Village proposal has been made through Determination, Inc. D/FW is ranked 10th in U.S. cities with highest senior populations. Before 2020, seniors will begin to outnumber young children. In 2 years, there will not be enough caretakers for seniors. The Senior Village model allows seniors to age in place, will provide seniors with social and educational events, volunteer opportunities, and vetted services. Surveys were provided to receive input on senior needs, programs, etc. Google *Village to Village* network for more info. Vikki Martin announced that our key underwriters for this year's event are City Credit Union and Young Chevrolet.
