MEETING MINUTES

Bill Coleman started the meeting at 6:50 p.m. with a statement that tonight's meeting would be dedicated to the memory of Nicole Miller for her contributions to the community.

Action Item: Mark Wisness moved and Gary Hasty seconded a motion to approve the minutes of September 16, 2019.

Coleman introduced Lorraine Birabil, new state representative for House District 100. Daniel Clayton and Jasmine Crockett, fellow candidates for the State House District 100 seat, were also introduced.

New Dallas Park Board members Daniel Wood and Maria Hasbany were introduced.

BOARD ELECTIONS

Coleman introduced FRI Board members present and a slate of candidates. The slate was elected by acclamation.

RECENT FUNDING

FRI thanked the Forest Hills Neighborhood Association, David Weekly Homes, and the East Dallas Networking for their recent donations to FRI.

On North Texas Giving Day (September 2019) FRI received \$17,200 in initial challenge funds, raised a total of \$41,148 from a total of 140 donors.

ELECTED OFFICIALS UPDATES

Erin Moore, for County Commissioner Theresa Daniel (District 1)

Moore spoke on Commissioner Daniel's success in getting \$5M in funding for Ash Creek Greenbelt Trail.

DISD Trustee Dan Micciche (District 3)

Micciche spoke on Early College program, four additional career institutes coming. G.W. Truett School is to become an ACE campus. School safety and security are being updated, including thumb locks on all interior school doors. DISD is seeking better relations with and between students.

City Councilmember Paula Blackmon (District 9)

- Blackmon spoke on need for White Rock Lake dredging, including what areas of lake need dredging, how to fund project, and can how the State provide funding.
- She spoke on the Trinity Forest Spine Trails update.
- She is looking for community ideas on Samuell Park update.
- The Gus Thomasson/Ferguson Road intersection is now open.
- The Lakeland Bridges are due to be completed by April 20.
- She is working with Dallas Police Department and Code Compliance Department for better security at the Texaco/New World Apartments area, near Ferguson/I-635.
- She has found funding for Highland/Ferguson Roads intersection improvement.
- She is also seeking funds for Ash Creek/Highland Road replacement bridge.

City Councilmember Adam Bazaldua (District 7)

- Bazaldua announced that the irrigation system for White Rock Hills Park has been funded.
- New sidewalks from Bishop Lynch School to Lakeland have been funded.
- He is working with zoning and code compliance for improving the northeast corner of John West and Buckner Boulevard.
- Three large scale gambling sites have been closed.
- The Timberlawn property on Samuell Boulevard will be developed as single-family homes. A new park will be included and plans call for the preservation of old growth trees.
- He spoke on improvements to the Austin Street Shelter for the homeless.
- He spoke on blurring the city council district lines between Districts 7 and 9 so he and Blackmon can support area projects and ideas regardless of district lines.
- In response to a question about getting a grocery store in the area, he referred to an "out of the box" pilot program in The Cedars area as an approach.

Sgt Shannon Smith, Dallas Police Department

Smith spoke on new chief Bill Griffith and Senior Corporal Andrew Duba at Northeast Station. He reviewed 2018 and 2019 crime stats over4 zones in our area:

Daniel Wood announced a VIP Training Session on Saturday, March21 (CANCELLED due to Covid-19)

Alan Sale, 2020 Census

- Sale spoke on the importance of the census, how it helps determine additional seats in the House of Representatives and federal funding allocation.
- Residents can respond by internet, phone, mail or interview. Self-response begins March 12. April 1 is official Census Day.
- Some of FRI area reports only 25% or less of their population. It has been especially difficult to report children under five.
- The Census Bureau is still hiring people to help with the census.

Mitchell Boone and Josh Esparza, Owenwood Farm & Neighbor Space

- They have received a grant to repair the church building with new HVAC, new flooring, and community gardening.
- They are interested in having a nonprofit grocery store, are working with the City Council on this.
- They will have a Freedom School summer camp, and ESL and GED classes are coming.

Andrea Hernandez and Maria Valenzuela, Volunteering

- FRI is seeking volunteers for the Spring Cleanup, for Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA), for book drive, for Reading Across America, and for Reading Partners.
- Rob Brown and Debbie Shaw spoke on the Reading Partners program at Bayles School and their need for more volunteers. They currently need 72 tutors, but have only 22.

Vikki Martin and Dan Ortman, Planning for the Future

- Vikki Martin spoke on recent positive projects happening in the area include:
 - Working with the City of Dallas on the Ash Creek Greenbelt Trail
 - o Reconstructing Highland Road
 - Rehabilitating former Enchanted Hills Apartments
 - Tearing down rundown apartments on Highland for future White Rock Hills Community Recreation CENTER and park expansion
 - Helping with Heroes Housing project on Highland
 - o Working with David Weekly Homes on new development on Highland
 - Helping with new Ferguson Town Homes project on Ferguson
 - Securing Ferguson Road intersection improvements
 - o Casa View Shopping Center improvements by Greater Casa View Alliance
 - o Harry Stone Aquatic Center by Greater Casa View Alliance
 - Estates at Shiloh, affordable Senior Housing via Greater Casa View Alliance
- They showed a slide of the Trinity Forest Spine Trail from Lawnview DART station to Highland Road, how that will connect us to Dallas' trail system.
- Ortman spoke on need for volunteers to help develop our mission and Strategic Plan.
